## 2.6 Innovative Processes Adopted By the Institution in Teaching and Learning:

Institution has adopted several innovative methods to enhance teaching and learning process. These are:

In order to inculcate research aptitude among the post graduate students, they are involved in research work by way of providing them small research projects. In the current year, Post Graduate Department of Sociology organised an ethnographic study of the village Kotli Devan where students of M.A Sociology and teachers went door to door to fill up questionnaires about various aspects of village life. The students also presented field reports in forms of papers in class seminars. Similarly department of basic Sciences organized an awareness generation camp in the village *Khunna Kalan* on veremicomposting and make the villagers aware about the organic methods of agriculture.

- Some of the department of the college are practising inter disciplinary teaching such as the department of Punjabi, English, Mathematics, Computer science and Commerce.
- Role playing, Case studies, Projects and assignments are given to the students so as to give them in hand experience. The teachers guide and help the students in preparing articles, case studies and research papers for National Seminars.
- Arrangement of extension lectures, workshops for giving insight into various topics relating to the curriculum. In order to promote learning and research aptitude among B.Com final and M.Com students, they are given small research projects covering Muktsar and nearby areas.
- Arrangement of student's visits in different firms, stock exchange, banks etc. for giving practical knowledge of the topics mentioned in the curriculum.
- Video lecture on different topics for different classes are shared with students from the well known factual of universities and ITT's
- Students are given assignments from the question bank prepared by the experienced teachers and also they are helped in solving previous university papers.
- Various teaching models/ aids like projectors, maps, blackboard, computer, internet, charts are used in the class-room.

- Students are taught difficult formulas in simplified manner. Slow and advance learners are identified by giving weekly tests from planned weekly syllabus and by asking questions regularly in the class.
- Emphasis on e-learning with the help of e- resources such as INFLIBNET and e-pg pathshala.
- Newspaper activity of students. Every students of the department get newspaper (personally) in the college from February. Students make the files of newspapers. Students got practical knowledge of various subjects like Economics, Business, and Management through this practice.

## **5. Student Support and Progression**

### **5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services**

## 5.6 Details of Student Counseling and Career Guidance

- The Career Guidance Cell guides the students about unconventional carrier opportunities available for them.
- To shape the young minds for their career different Personality development programs are organized so that they can prepare themselves for appropriate career.
- In this lineage college organized workshops under Skill Development Programme to prepare students for becoming successful entrepreneurs. In this year the Department of Commerce organised two months' workshop under its skill development programme on "Tally Accounting" from February 8 to April 8, 2017. The students were trained about how to prepare financial records in the computerized form. The students can choose their carrier in accounting directly after attending such a workshop and can adopt it as a source of their income. Similarly, department of commerce organized a one day Workshop on "E-Filing of Tax Returns" on April 19, 2017. The resource person was Advocate Vishal Khurana. - To take feedback of students so as to improve teaching learning process by way of feedback forms and suggestion box.
- Connectivity with students even after working hours through social media.
- To organize co-curricular competitions like quiz, debates & other competitions.

- To inculcate newspaper reading habits in students.

### **6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation**

- Examination is conducted by affiliating university at the end of each semester i.e. twice in the year, in December and May. The question papers for these exams are set by externals as well as the answer sheets are evaluated by externals in various evaluation centres established by the university.
- In Evaluation, the semester exams contribute the major percentage of marks. Rest percentage of marks is contributed either by internal assessment or by both the internal assessment and practical exam marks (in case of practical subjects).
- Internal assessment considers the student's performance in house exams which are conducted by the institute under supervision of Registrar and House examination committee, following the university's guidelines. The questions papers for these tests are set by subject teachers. They also evaluate the answer sheets. To ensuring transparency, the answer sheets of house tests are shown to students.
- Class attendance/ class tests/ assignment marks/ participations etc. are also the contributors of internal assessment.

### **6.3.4 Research and Development**

Furniture incharge also put his best efforts in maintenance and creation of new furniture. New lab equipments, software etc were purchased totaling the expenditure amount on fixed assets to Rs. 10,43,121/-. Amount of Rs. 36,51,814/- was spend on maintenance of infrastructure.

### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Job oriented short term certificate course on “Tally Accounting” was organised for skill development in post graduate students of commerce department. - MOU with IQBRI, Pvt. Ltd, Mohali was signed and one month skill Development Programme on “Electronic System Design and Maintenance” was organised in collaboration with them.
- Department of Mathematics and Business administration conducted the workshop to impart skill for cracking competitive exams.
- Workshop on ‘Computer and Internet Learning’ was organised for the teachers to impart computer skills.
- Personality development camps were organised in the college.
- For the overall development of students they were encouraged to join NCC, NSS. This will also help them in earning points for jobs.
- Career guidance and coaching cell counselled and gave coaching to the students.
- Institute helped the needy students by providing them financial assistance in form of fee concession to students belonging to poor families, backward class, SC category, etc. under various schemes of Government and Institutional policy.
- All the students are covered under group insurance scheme of top management.
- For self defense, Sikh martial arts i.e. Gatka training was given to willing students.
- Blood donation camp was organised in the campus. Staff members were encouraged to carry out research work for their career enhancement.
- Healthy work environment.

After scrutiny of applications, candidates are interviewed by selection panel.
- No recruitment of regular teaching position was done in the session of 2016-17 but, a faculty member was transferred to the institute.

**The Context:** In the changed socio-economic scenario and Global needs, students need to be taught about the challenges and opportunities available so that they can be well placed in the society as good citizens.

##### **The Practice: I. Use of ICT based teaching:**

- \* The college has formally set up three smart class rooms and installed four projectors in different class rooms to facilitate teacher to deliver ICT based

lectures.

- \* The institute has INFLIBNET facility for the students and teachers.
- \* The department of commerce has been teaching M. Com students using e-learning resource “e-pgpathshala” undertaken by National Mission on Education under the aegis of HRD Ministry of Govt. of India.
- \* The department of Business administration is using Video clips from various educational websites like MIT, educational channels on YouTube, and websites of companies in the field of Business education for the students of BBA course. The department of Mathematics is using video lectures for M.Sc. students from National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL).
- \* The PG Department of Sociology is teaching post graduate students through power point presentations. Students are also encouraged to give their seminar presentation through this mode. Apart from this video lectures of prominent academicians are also shown in the class.
- \* PG Department of History is showing short films on historical monuments to teach one paper “Medieval Indian Art and Monuments” of the post graduate course.

#### **I. Corporate method of Teaching:**

- \* Department of Home Science is using corporate method of teaching. They train some students in garment making and those students train other students.

#### **II. Enactment of Plays:**

- \* The department of English is using this method. Stories, Plays prescribed in syllabus of different courses are enacted by the students. This enhances the understanding of the students as well improves their communication skills.

#### **III. Screening of Movies and Documentaries:**

- \* Also teaching through movies is done in courses where relevant e.g ‘Rocket Singh Salesman of the year’ is the best movie which is highly relevant for the subject of sales management in the fifth semester of BBA course. Documentary of Dam construction in Himachal Pradesh is shown is the subject of Project Management in the fourth semester.
- \* The department of English show movies based on the stories, plays and novels

prescribed in the syllabus of various courses.

#### **IV. Situational Teaching:**

- \* Situational teaching is used by the teachers in department of English while teaching the concepts like prepositions etc. to make abstract things concrete and easy to comprehend for the students.

**V. Evidence of success:** Increased response and participation of the students in classes and their growing enthusiasm for all the curricular and co-curricular activities organised in the campus serves as an evidence of success of the non-conventional methods of teaching.

**VI. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** Going off a beaten track always brings challenges with it. In preparing the campus for non-conventional teaching methods, the teachers as well as the students are to be motivated first to think different. Further, some of the above mentioned methods require quite considerable amount of funds the management of which is always a test for the institution.

### **BEST PRACTICE – II**

**Title: Enabling Students to Develop Entrepreneurial and Job Oriented Skills;**

**Goals:** While providing quality education, promoting job oriented skills among the students is mission of the college. To achieve it various training programmes, industrial visits etc are carried out by the institution.

**The Context:** In the changed socio-economic scenario and Global needs students need to be taught job oriented skills so that they can be well placed in their life.

**The Practice:**

#### **I. Skill Development Programmes:**

- \* The college is offering three skill development programmes i.e. B. Sc (Fashion Designing) BBA and M. Sc (Fashion Designing).

#### **II. Industrial Internships:**

- \* Students of BBA, B. Com and B. Sc. (Fashion Designing) course go for summer internship of six to eight weeks in industrial units. It gives them practical experience and helps them in getting jobs at such places.

#### **III. Skill Development Training Programmes/Workshops:**

- \* Department of Computer Science and Economics organised one month skill development training workshop on 'Electronic System Design and Maintenance' sponsored by *Pardhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yozna*, Govt. of India (from 15/2/16 to 15/3/16).
- \* Since 2012 Department of Business Administration and Mathematics is organising two week workshop on 'How to prepare for competitive examinations'. 400 students have been benefited from this programme.
- \* Department of Fashion Designing organised an exhibition 'Fashionista' on 6/3/2017 in which garment articles like Baby bed sets, bed sheets, cushion covers, pillow covers, embroidered suits and duppattas made by students were displayed.
- \* Department of Fashion Designing organised 'Fashion Glam' a fashion show showcasing the dresses designed and constructed with accessories by the students on 16/3/2017.
- \* Department of Home Science every year organises workshops to train students to make different articles resulting in developing skills like 'toy making', 'Vegetable Chopping', 'preparing different food items' etc.
- \* The Department of commerce organised **two months training workshop on "Tally Accounting"** from February 8 to April 8, 2017. The students were trained about how to prepare financial records in the computerized form. The students can choose their carrier in accounting directly after attending such a workshop and can adopt it as a source of their income.
- \* The Department of commerce organized a **one day Workshop on "E-Filing of Tax Returns"** on April 19, 2017. The resource person was Advocate Vishal Khurana. The objective of the workshop was to make the students and teachers aware about the process of filing the tax returns, its detail procedure, Tax Deduction at Source and its computation etc.

#### **IV. Project Works:**

- \* Students of Business Administration join Financial organisations in the final semester and study the functioning of that industry. They also prepare a

dissertation (project work) on any aspect of the function of the industrial units.

- \* Students of B. Sc (Fashion Designing) undertake project work in the industries related to their syllabus and prepare a dissertation of the same and submit in the department.
- \* Students of Commerce join Industrial Units in the final semester of their course and study the functioning of that industry. They also prepare a dissertation (project work) on any aspect of the function of the industrial units and submit the same in the department.

#### **V. Industrial Visits/Field Trips:**

- \* Department of Commerce, Business Administration and Fashion Designing take to students to industrial units, financial organisations like Banks etc. for field trips to enable students to understand the functioning of these units.
- 1. Evidence of Success:** All these efforts of the college and the faculty resulted in finding the livelihood for many students. They find jobs in banks, industries and teaching as well. Some of them had established their own small units like garment shops, Tailoring houses etc.
  - 2. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** The institute being situated in remote and border area there are very few industrial units around. Students have to go far off places for project works and they get very little chance of getting jobs locally.
