GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR STUDENTS RELATED TO HOUSE EXAMINATION

For UG Students:

- House examination are conducted twice an academic session i. e. one for each semester.
- First Pre-semester examinations are held in the second week of October.
- The second Pre-semester examinations are held in the Second week of March.
- The pre-semester examinations are conducted in two sessions i. e. morning & evening. The timing for morning session is from 9:30 am to 11:00 am.
- The timing for the evening session is from 12:00 noon to 01:30 pm.
- The question papers are set from 50% of the syllabus prescribed for the semester.
- The maximum marks for the pre-semester exams are 50% of the total marks.
- Re-test conducted for fail students for further improvement in academic by concerned faculty.
- Internal assessment for UG classes is
 - 5% for academic activities (Seminars, Project work and assignments)
 - 3% for cocurricular activities
 - 2% for class attendance.
 - *Beside this, behavior in the class, and observance of discipline is also taken into consideration.

For PG students:

- House examination are conducted twice in an academic session.
- First pre-semester examinations are held in the second week of November.
- The second pre-semester examinations are held in the second week of April.
- The timing for Pre-semester examinations is from 9:30 am to 12:30 am.
- The question papers are set from the whole syllabus prescribed for the semester.
- The maximum marks for the pre-semester exams are as per university examination pattern.
- Internal assessment for P.G classes criteria of internal Assessment will be followed as prescribed in the syllabus.

Important Note:

• It is mandatory to pass the house examination, failing in examination will affect the internal assessment.

- 75% attendance is compulsory for final examination by university.
- Grievance related to house examination, evaluation and internal assessment can be reported in the written form to registrar, House Examination.

MECHANISM FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and variety. Guidelines for internal assessments are decided by the affiliated university are as follows:

For UG courses 10% and for PG courses 20% internal assessment marks in theory exams is given as per following parameters

i. Academic performance-ii. Extracurricular activities-iii. Attendance -50% Marks30% marks20% Marks

For implementation of transparent internal assessment following measures are taken:

- The guidelines of internal assessment are communicated at the commencement of session in student orientation programs and through tutorial groups.
- To assess the academic performance, the house examination branch conduct one mid semester examination (MST) and instruct to conduct two-unit tests at department levels.
- The evaluated answers sheets of MST are showed to students and discrepancy in marks is resolved by the concerned subject teachers, Heads of Departments (HODs) and Registrar, house examination.
- Students are also assessed continuously through various evaluation process like group discussion, seminars, assignments and field visits.
- Marks of internal assessments are displayed to students on notice board and also checked by house examination committee. Discrepancies in the assessments are resolved by concerned HODs and the committee.

MECHANISM TO DEAL WITH INTERNAL/EXTERNAL EXAMINATION RELATED GRIEVANCES

The Mechanism to deal with examination related grievances is transparent, time bound and efficient. The college resolve grievances related to House examination (internal) and University examination (external) at different levels

Mechanism to deal with Grievances related to internal Examination

The college has an examination committee comprising of Registrar and members, House Examination committee that work in coordination with subject teachers and HODs to handle the issues related to house examination, internal assessment and evaluation. The committee work under a well-defined mechanism to resolve the following issues:

- Clashes in date sheet
- Paper pattern
- Awards in MST
- Internal assessment
- Student Absentee during examination and conduct of retest for such students.

To minimise the grievances and to set transparent mechanism of examination college take measures in advance as follows

- The college follows strictly the guidelines and rules issued by the affiliating university while conducting mid semester and for internal assessment.
- Examination calendar in prepared at the commencement of session and displayed to students on notice board for prior intimation.
- Datasheet is displayed to students on notice board at least a week before. Issues of clashes in paper are resolved by concerned member of house examination committee.
- The examination branch collect question papers 15 days before the commencement of MST. The discrepancies in papers are identified by the committee and instructed to concerned teachers for corrections.
- Answer sheets are evaluated within one week after the completion of MST and paper shown to students to maintain transparent and precise evaluation process.
- Also, for transparent and fair evaluation, Internal assessments are also displayed to students on notice boards. Concerned Subject teachers and HODs resolve students complain at

department level first. The unresolved issued are further resolved by the examination committee.

Mechanism to deal with Grievances related to external Examination

The College appoint the nodal officers, co-ordinators and superintendents as per the norms of affiliated university for smooth conduct of examination. appointed during the exams. Problems in datasheets, question papers are resolved through telephonic or e-mail communication. Grievances related to admit cards, results, DMC etc are set by clerical staff in administrative block.
